Affiliate Membership (Non-voting): An option for profit organizations that are not a therapeutic, tool, platform, manufacturing, device, or engineering company. Members will be allowed to join any committee provided there is not a conflict of interest, as decided by committee chairs as long as they are working for one or more ARM member companies or organizations on matters related to the projects. Service providers are to announce their member client/s relationship when joining ARM committee discussions

Mergers and Acquisitions Policy

Post a merger or an acquisition of a member company, the new parent or acquiring company will have to update their membership dues as determined by the size and revenue of the new parent or acquiring company at the anniversary of their renewal or within a 6-month period, whichever occurs earlier. ARM reserves the right to terminate membership benefits if dues are not revisited within this time period.
